

The Competition Commission (the Commission) is an independent statutory body established under the Competition Ordinance (Cap. 619) (the Ordinance) which was enacted in June 2012. The objectives of the Ordinance include the prohibition of conduct that prevents, restricts or distorts competition in Hong Kong.

The Commission is seeking interested applicants to join its professional team for the following position:

Competition Affairs Officer (Investigations III) (Ref.: CC/CAOINVIIISO20240209)

The position holder is responsible for conducting investigations into potential anti-competitive conduct in Hong Kong.

Responsibilities

- To carry out investigative steps, to review and analyse evidence in investigations into potential contravention of the Competition Ordinance;
- To provide assistance to the Commission's legal counsel in enforcement litigation proceedings before the Competition Tribunal;
- To represent the Commission in public activities such as advocacy and educational initiatives if requested, and provide general support to the various other functions of the Commission;
- To maintain liaison with regulatory or law enforcement authorities;
- To handle incoming/outgoing calls and enquiries from Contact Center; and
- To perform any other tasks assigned by supervisors.

Requirements

- A university degree, preferably in law, economics, criminology, government or public administration, or equivalent;
- 4 years of experience in a relevant field in a regulatory, law enforcement, or compliance role, particularly a strong advantage with exposure in intelligence gathering / case investigation and law enforcement engagement;
- Good command of written and spoken English and Chinese, with strong presentation and writing skills;
- Strong research skills, analytical ability and solid project management skills;
- Proficiency in using MS Office software including Excel, Word and Power Point;
- Attentive to details and good organizing abilities; and
- Ability to work well in teams.

Candidates with less experience may be considered for a more junior position and a salary commensurate with that position.

Terms of Appointment and Remuneration Package

Terms:	Appointment will be offered on a 2-year fixed-term contract, renewable depending on performance and operational needs.
Basic Salary:	The starting salary for this post is HK\$34,425 per month and will be commensurate with the candidate's qualifications and experience.
Cash Allowance:	5% of the basic salary
Contract-end Gratuity:	10% of the basic salary (including 5% employer's contribution of MPF)
Fringe Benefits:	Annual leave, medical & dental benefits, life insurance and MPF.

The closing date for application is **1 March 2024**.

Where a large number of candidates meet the specified entry requirements, the recruiting section may devise shortlisting criteria to select the better qualified candidates for further processing. In these circumstances, only shortlisted candidates will be invited to attend the written test and/or interview. Candidates who are selected for interview will normally receive an invitation in about six to eight weeks from the closing date.

All applications will be handled in strict confidence. Personal data collected from applicants will only be used for recruitment related purposes and will not be transferred to any third party. Personal data of unsuccessful applicants will be destroyed within 12 months of the recruitment process being completed by the appointment of a candidate for the relevant position.
